Dual nationals facing a challenge when travelling

We know a lot of EU/UK dual nationals face a challenge when travelling between the UK and the EU, because of the need to enter/leave the EU with an EU passport, and

the need to enter the UK with a UK passport. This has got worse since February this year, when the UK started strictly enforcing its ETA (Electronic Travel Authorisation) scheme. It will get even more complex when the EU brings in its equivalent ETIAS (European Travel Information and Authorisation System) scheme.

While we don't usually share petitions, we thought it useful to highlight this petition to the UK Parliament which clearly expresses the problem:

This is a good time to remind you that those dual nationals who had status under the EU Settlement Scheme before naturalising as British citizens are able to travel on ***just*** their non-British passport.

In March, [we wrote to both the EU Commission and the UK Cabinet Office](#) asking them to provide more and better solutions for dual nationals. We are unfortunately still waiting for a reply!
