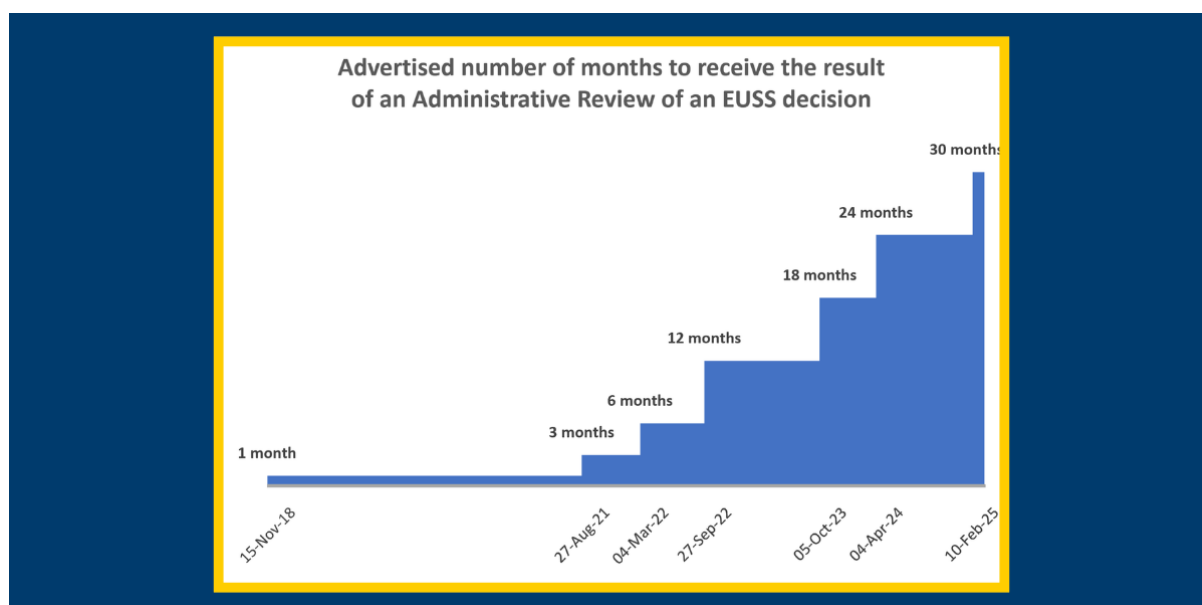

Thousands of EU citizens left waiting for years for ‘administrative reviews’ on their status

As part of our research and policy work into identifying the challenges facing EU citizens in the UK we analyse Home Office statistics, submit freedom of information requests, and publish the results on our website, [here](#). Our webpage contains sections not only on how many EU citizens there are in the UK and how many grants of EUSS status have been made, but also on waiting times, size of the EUSS backlog, and data on challenging EUSS refusals through administrative reviews and the appeals process.

When someone applies for EUSS status but wrongly receives a refusal, an administrative review (AR) was intended to be a quick and affordable way of requesting that the Home Office check the refusal decision for a casework error, rather than having to go through a lengthy and costly appeal process involving the immigration tribunal system. When the EUSS was opened in 2019, the Home Office said such ARs would be completed within 28 days. However this promise did not last long - as the chart below shows:



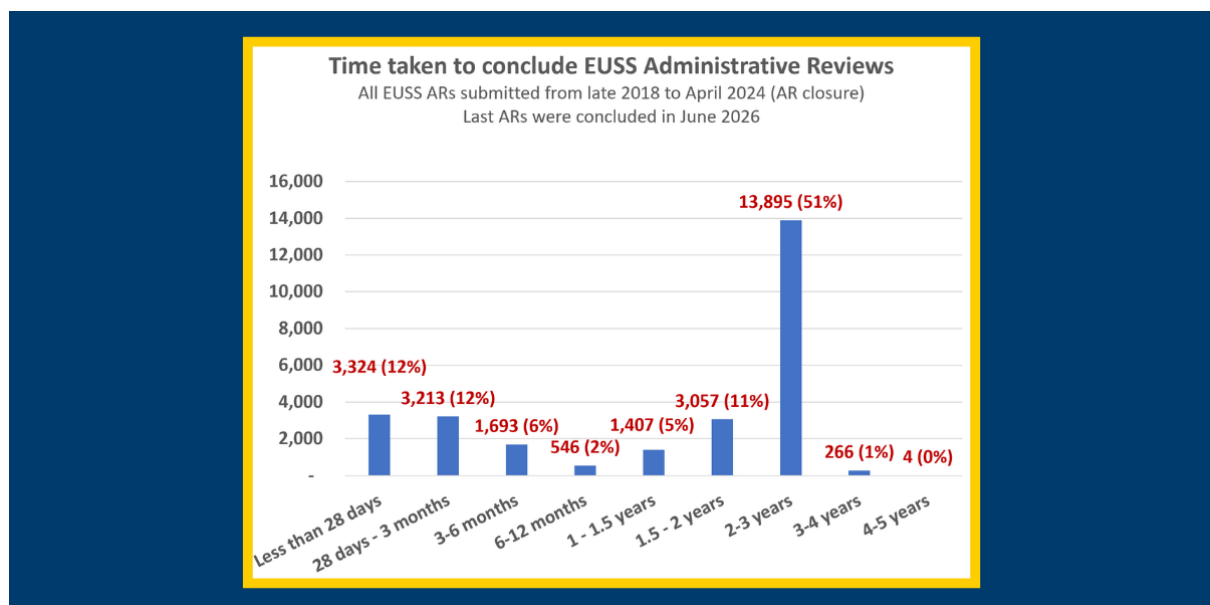
This chart is particularly shocking since the Home Office announced in September 2023 that it would no longer be possible to request an AR on any refusals made after 5 October 2023, and stopped accepting any ARs altogether after 4 April 2024. Yet the waiting times continued to go up.

Only in June this year was the backlog finally cleared - **more than two yearss**ince the AR route was closed. No-one should now be waiting for the outcome of an EUSS AR anymore.

Once we knew all ARs had been processed, we submitted a freedom of information request to find out just how long ARs had taken to process.

The result is devastating - over half of all ARs took between 2 and 3 years to complete.

This means that 13,895 people had been left in limbo for up to 36 months. During this agonising wait, they not only lacked certainty over their future in the UK, making it harder to work, rent, study or get support from the state, but they were also effectively trapped in the UK - since travelling abroad, even to attend a family funeral, would risk being [refused re-entry back to the UK](#).



Although of course not all ARs resulted in the original refusal being overturned, we know nearly 4,000 ARs did result in a successful grant of EUSS status.
